

ICAR-DCFR organized NFDB sponsored training & input distribution programme under NEH activity covering soil and water testing for aquaculture during 30th November to 5th December, 2015

ICAR-Directorate of Coldwater Fisheries Research, Bhimtal, Uttarakhand organized a 5 day NFDB sponsored training programme on “Techniques for fish farming in mid-altitude fish pond of Donglok & Chug village, Dirang, West Kameng district in Arunachal Pradesh” during 1-5 December, 2015 at Chug village in collaboration with KVK, Dirang. The programme included skill development in Chinese carp farming; hatchery and nursery management, feed preparation, fish health management, soil and water quality parameter estimation, integrated fish farming and on-farm demonstration. On this occasion, critical inputs like seed and fishing nets were also distributed to 30 beneficiaries under NEH activity. Estimation of soil & water quality parameters of fish ponds were demonstrated to fish farmers for maintaining healthy culture environment. Soil samples were also collected from fish ponds of 15 beneficiaries for preparation of Aquaculture Soil Health Card. The programme was successfully coordinated by Dr Deepjyoti Baruah, Sr Scientist, Dr R. S. Haldar, ACTO & Mrs Pragyan Dash, Scientist from the Directorate.
